### **Reading at Grove**

The children have continued to enjoy reading books written by their author for the term and studying poems by a range of poets. We were fortunate to welcome Juliet Clare Bell to school. Juliet wrote a book about the Cadbury brothers which year 2 have read this term. She inspired many of our budding writers as she worked with children in workshops and assemblies.

National Storytelling week was a popular event that once again promoted a love of reading. Children particularly enjoyed bringing their own books from home and sharing them with their class. ### **Curriculum and learning**

Children across school have worked very hard and continue to do their best. Highlights of the curriculum this half – term have included:

Nursery – watching the chicks hatch and grow, holding chicks and learning how to be gentle and caring.

Reception – a visit from the Hobgoblin theatre company, acting out traditional tales and exploring in Forest School.

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Year 1- studying the work of Terry Frost and working with hands on Science to design and make boats that float.

Year 2 – learning about the work of the Cadbury brothers, reading about Charlie's adventures in the chocolate factory and ending the project with a chocolate themed day.

Year 3 – taking part in our Grove version of the Olympic Games and the project finale where children became chefs and created a delicious Greek meze.

Year 4 – a visit to Birchfield Mosque and the creation of beautiful Islamic tiles linked to their study of ancient Islamic civilisations.

Year 5 – working with Just 3 Clicks to develop understanding of radicalisation and extremism through drama and the story of Aisla and her brother. Reading the class novel Journey to Jo'Burg by Beverley Naidoo.

Year 6 – the visit to Soho House to find out about the life and work of Mathew Boulton and James Watt. Children devised their own worksheets, which allowed them to explore in depth their own areas of interests. The study of Benjamin Zephaniah and his poem 'The British'
