Reporting an Absence

If your child is absent from school please inform school by email k.omahoney@grove.bham.sch.uk, informing the school office in person or by telephone on 0121 464 1032 by 8.45am. Any non-urgent medical and dental appointments should be made outside of school hours.

If we do not hear from you on the first day of absence, we will contact you at home to find out the reason for the absence. Please inform school in you change address or telephone numbers. Where we do not receive information about an absence we will write to you to obtain the information.

Leave in term time

Grove School follows Birmingham Local Authority and The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) regulations 2006 which means that Head Teachers no longer authorise leave during term time. Leave in term time results in unauthorised absence and may lead to the issuing of a penalty notice and legal action being taken. Your child may also lose their school place. Currently we have waiting lists for every year group; demand for school places at Grove is high.

Birmingham City Council have issued **18 penalty notices** to parents at Grove School since February 2017 due to leave in term time with a number of other penalty notices pending.

Spotlight on attendance

At Grove we believe good attendance results in our children making greater progress and achieving well in school. We monitor attendance very carefully.

Should your child's attendance become a cause for concern we will arrange for a member of staff to meet with you to explore reasons for poor attendance. School can offer support in a range of ways to help you improve your child's attendance, some families have found an Early Help assessment and work with a Family Support Worker has helped them.

Where we have concerns regarding a child's attendance we will follow Birmingham City Councils "Spotlight" procedure where we will support families with improving attendance. If attendance fails to improve it may result in court action.

From September, Birmingham Local Authority have moved to the "Single Justice" procedure. In cases where penalty notices have not been paid or the level of offence requires the matter going straight to Court, parents will now be sent a 'Single Justice Notice. This gives parents the option to plead not guilty (so a trial date will then be set); plead not guilty but have their case heard in court, or plead not guilty and have the matter dealt with by a single Magistrate and Legal Advisor with no need for either the local authority or the parent to be present.

Let's make sure we achieve 96% attendance in Spring 2018.
