Dear Parents and Carers,

Congratulations to our **Year 6 cricket team** who came third in the Warwickshire Schools' County Cricket finals. Over 200 schools competed in this competition, What a brilliant performance from our Grove players. The inspiration to participate in this event with the Warwickshire Cricket Team came from one of our children, we would like to thank the parents of Hamza in Year 5 for introducing Grove to the 'Chance to Shine' project with Warwickshire Cricket Club.

Educational visits have been a great success, with opportunities to learn first-hand about fossils, the provenance of our food, the Victorians and their legacy in the Midlands as well as life during war time Britain. We've been busy, so far this term Year 2 children have visited The Brighouse in Atherstone to explore the countryside; Year 3 children searched for fossils at Wren's Nest in Dudley, Year 4 children visited Tesco as part of the Farm to Fork trail, Year 5 children enjoyed a visit to the Black Country Museum, stepping back in time to see how the Victorians lived and Year 6 visited the Imperial War Museum and The Lowry Gallery in Manchester. So many members of the public have complimented the excellent behaviour of our children on the trips, we are rightly proud of our children. Our **school website** has been updated over the summer holidays. Please look out for the 'Curriculum Journey' pages, where teachers will upload good examples of childrens' work.

A **Spotlight on attendance** letter has been posted to all parents. We all agree that it's important that our children attend school regularly. Congratulations to the 39 children who achieved 100% attendance in 2016-17, we hope they all enjoyed spending their book voucher in the holiday and to the 380 children who achieved an attendance for the year of 96% and above in 2016-17. Rewards for 100% attendance each term include badges, certificates and prizes. We are celebrating good attendance.

In 2016-17 fourteen parents received **penalty notices** when they took children out of school during term time. From September 2017, pupil absence Court cases will be moved to the 'Single Justice' procedure. This will mean that if penalty notices are not paid promptly or the level of the offence necessitates the matter going straight to court, parents will be sent a 'Single Justice Notice.' The important thing is that children attend school regularly. Grove school does not authorise leave in term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Our **school councillors** have been elected, do look on our website to see the terrific speeches they gave to their classes. School councillors will be working with their classes to update our anti-bullying policy. I know many parents have concerns about online bullying when their children are on the internet at home. We will have a focused week of work during 13-17th November 2017 on anti-bullying. The theme of the anti-bullying week will be 'All Different, All Equal.' Before this focused week our children will be exploring themes of speaking out, having a voice if they hear or see behaviour that is not acceptable. Our **Grove School Expectations** remain the core values of our school, these are:

- We are honest and tell the truth
- We are good listeners and thoughtful speakers
- We always treat others as we would want to be treated.
