Why people and things that happened in the past are important

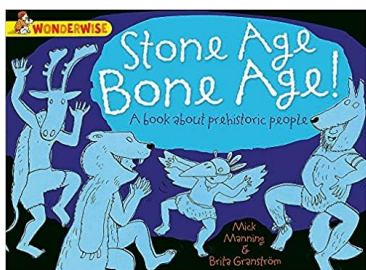
I can talk about what burial sites can tell a historian.
