



Spring 2 – Printing: Modern Art Artist: Andy Warhol

In sculpture I have already learnt to:

Use a range of natural and manmade objects to stamp and press onto paper (spools, vegetables, leaves, sponge, crushed paper, corks, flowers, bottle tops) Experiment with the amount of paint used to make a print Make prints of a range of colours using a range of objects Make printing blocks by drawing and pressing into plasticine, clay, potatoes or polystyrene Print on paper, card and fabric Make a simple pattern using a single object or block Make a pattern using 2 blocks and two colours Make a monoprint

Art words I have learnt:

Stamp, press, experiment, poster paint, acrylic paint, printing ink, apply, blurred, Indistinct, impressing, surface, pattern, blocks, compose, monoprint, horizontal, vertical

I can select and adapt everyday materials to make **block prints** (corrugated card, sandpaper, textured wallpaper)

I understand that a block print is a mirror image of the block used to make it

I can make an incised block by engraving into a vegetable (potato), clay or plasticine or polystyrene

I can experiment with block printing techniques

- Overlayer prints to create different colours and textures
- Texturing the surface of the block
- Cutting away parts of the block to emphasise certain features

I can make a **relief block**

- Glue string, textured paper or small objects to card to create a relief surface to take a print from (collograph)
- Take a rubbing from a relief block

I can create repeated images and patterns on paper and fabric
