Spring 1 – Printing. Artists: Albrecht Durer, Henri Toulouse-Lautrec

In printing I have already learnt to:

Select and adapt everyday materials to make block prints (corrugated card, sandpaper, textured wallpaper)

Understand that a block print is a mirror image of the block used to make it

Make an incised block by engraving into a vegetable (potato), clay or plasticine or polystyrene

Experiment with block printing techniques

- Overlay prints to create different colours and textures
- Texturing the surface of the block
- Cutting away parts of the block to emphasise certain features

Make a relief block

- Glue string, textured paper or small objects to card to create a relief surface to take a print from (collagraph)
- Take a rubbing from a relief block

Create repeated images and patterns on paper and fabric

Art words I have learnt:

Mirror image, Incised block, block printing, over layering, texturing, relief block, incise, carve, techniques, printing press, collagraph, select, adapt, observe, criticise, justify, convince, classify, interpret, construct, conveys, evokes, indicates

I can design by sketching on to paper

I can trace the design onto tracing paper and I can transfer the traced image

I can print using mono printing techniques

I can make a lino cut and use lino printing techniques

I know that marks will print in reverse so that any lettering should be drawn back to front

I know that cutting lines on the lino and cutting around the lines on lino produces different effects

I know that fine cuts will be less likely to print

I can print onto different surfaces to create different effects and I can make repeated patterns

I can use screen printing techniques; creating a masked area and cutting stencils out of newsprint

I can mix acrylic paint and fabric medium to achieve the colour for the design

I can use the squeegee to apply the paint.
