I know **what Matthew Boulton did** and **how this is similar and different to what the Cadbury brothers did** in Birmingham.

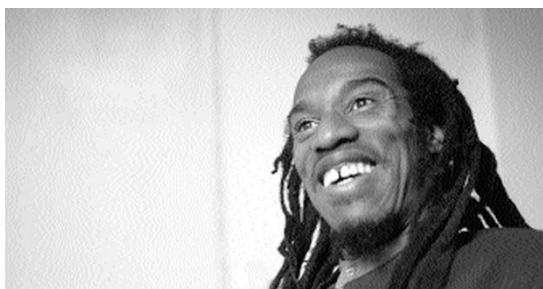
Historical significance
